Risk of Reading Difficulties Screener



Beginning this year, all students in kindergarten through second grade will participate in a new Risk of Reading Difficulties Screener as required by California Senate Bill 114.

MBUSD has adopted mCLASS with DIBELS Edition 8, developed by Amplify Education, as our state-approved screener.

- Short, one-on-one assessment administered 2-3 times per year
- Not a test for grades and does not diagnose dyslexia
- Identifies early risk factors in areas such as:
 - Phonological and phonemic awareness
 - Letter name knowledge
 - Phonics/decoding skills
 - Reading fluency
 - Reading comprehension.

The first screener with be for students in 1st and 2nd grade only, and will take place from September 10th-19th, 2025. Kindergarten students will take their first screener in December.

Results will also be used by teachers and support staff to guide classroom instruction and intervention as needed.

A letter with more information was sent from Ed Services on Monday, 9/25, and other communications will follow soon.
